Dear Mr. Enger:

This is to inform you that I have personally inspected the oil and gas lease site at the Beverly Hills High School on Monday, Oct. 28, 1963, Wednesday, Oct. 30, 1963, and Thursday, Oct. 31, 1963. On other dates, not noted above, between Oct. 9, and Oct. 21, 1963, a representative of the administrative staff has performed a similar visitation. The purpose of the daily visitations has been to ascertain the presence of a pumper or watchman on the site, as required by the lease between the Beverly Hills Unified School District and the Beverly Hills Oil Co. All visits have been made during school hours while children were using the playgrounds adjacent the site.


I wish to report that we have not at any time found a pumper or employee of the Beverly Hills Oil Co. on the site.

Further, the emergency sign posted at the entrance to the site lists the number OL. 46852 for emergency calls. I find it can hardly serve this purpose because dialing several times this date results in no answer.

An additional provision in the Apr. 4, 1961, Consent and Agreement, requires that the site be kept in a clean, orderly, safe, attractive condition. It does not qualify on any of these points. Your lack of attention to these matters creates a significant public relations problem and a vital pupil welfare concern.

Your prompt attention to remedy the items enumerated in this letter is strongly requested.
